Daniel Uhlfelder to Receive State Matching Funds

Uhlfelder is the only Dem AG candidate who will get matching funds this year

Santa Rosa Beach, FL — In the latest sign of growing momentum for his campaign, Daniel Uhlfelder has crossed the threshold to receive public matching funds. Uhlfelder joins Charlie Crist and Nikki Fried as the only Democrats running statewide now qualified to access these funds. Between his campaign and affiliated political committee, Uhlfelder has now raised \$208,034.83 from 3,296 contributions. This is nearly 2.5x the amount his closest competitor has raised, with nearly 9x the number of contributions. Uhlfelder is continuing to travel the state making the case to Democratic voters that he gives them the best chance to flip this seat in November. These matching funds strengthen that further.

Significantly, Uhlfelder is the *only* Democratic candidate for attorney general to file the necessary paperwork to receive matching funds. Per [rule 1S-2.047](#), candidates must submit form DS-DE 98 “no later than the date the candidate qualifies for office.” Uhlfelder’s Democratic opponents both qualified for the ballot last month and both failed to submit the request to receive matching funds through the general election. The previous Democratic nominee for attorney general, Sean Shaw, received \$365,591 in matching funds. Should either of Uhlfelder’s primary opponents receive the nomination, leaving this money on the table while Ashley Moody receives it would be an electoral liability for Democrats.

“I am thrilled that our grassroots supporters have powered our campaign across this critical threshold,” **said North Florida attorney Democratic candidate for Florida Attorney General Daniel Uhlfelder.** “As I travel the state, I am inspired by the incredible number of people who are coming on board because they know I will be relentless in pursuit of freedom and justice for their families. I’m taking on utility companies, oil and gas corporations, corporate real estate developers, and property insurance companies, and accessing these public matching funds will allow us to spread that message even further.”

Daniel Uhlfelder is a Stanford and Florida-educated lawyer with 25 years of legal experience who has dedicated his life to fighting for civil rights. Referred to by the media as Ron DeSantis’ “chief tormentor,” Daniel gained national fame for protesting DeSantis’ COVID mismanagement while dressed as the grim reaper. Daniel is ready to use his expertise to directly impact the lives of Floridians and the future of the Sunshine State, fighting for voting rights, consumer rights, and fundamental human rights.
