

THE BOARD OF NESS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
June 3, 2024

The Ness County Board of Commissioners met in regular session Monday, June 3, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. in the Ness County Commissioner Chambers. Chairman Mark Davis called the meeting to order with Commissioner Dave Albers, Travis Petersilie and Deputy County Clerk Makenzie Eck in attendance.

Noxious Weed

Noxious Weed Department Chilton Miller updated Commission on progress and effectiveness of spray coverage.

Road and Bridge

Ness County Road and Bridge/Landfill Supervisor Ron Johnson reported landfill fees for May 21 thru May 25 of \$370.00. Johnson is waiting for additional tire bids before making final decision. Tabled until June 10, 2024. Discussion on concrete replacement, dumpster relocation, bridge 66 repair (Bazine bridge), and old restrooms at the fairgrounds removed. Weekly schedule was presented. Johnson presented resignation received from Tracy Finley effective June 7, 2024.

Motion: Upon the motion of Petersilie, seconded by Albers, Commission voted unanimously to accept the resignation effective June 7, 2024.

Register of Deeds

Custodian Tina Harrison met with Commission to discuss maintenance and groundskeeping issues.

Accounts Payable

May Payroll and Accounts payable for May 31, 2024, were reviewed and approved.

Ness County EMS

Ness County EMS Director Kathy Clouston met with Commission to discuss user agreement for pagers/radios issued to EMS personnel, possible grants that are available for safety and equipment used for training, and camera options for Ambulances. Rotary Club may have scholarships available to use towards EMS training.

Attorney

Ness County Attorney Jacob Gayer reviewed and approved Accounts Payable vouchers. Gayer presented Commission information on a National Opioid Settlement from Kroger Co.

Motion: Upon the motion of Albers, seconded by Petersilie, Commission voted unanimously to have Attorney Gayer take the steps to "opt in" to the Kroger Co. Settlement.
