

LATE WORK

Homework is essential to measure the understanding of smaller concepts for individual students and helps build a good work ethic. Routine use of concepts learned also helps students retain that knowledge for use at a later time. In order to preserve the integrity of work assigned and completed by students on time and the ability for teachers to return homework in a timely manner, the following late work policy has been established.

Students are given one day to make up work for every day they are absent, up to five days. After that, the late work policy applies.

On an essay, project or research assignment that is made well in advance, the work is due on the assigned date even if a student has an excused absence during the intervening period. Students do not have an extra day to complete the work.

High School

If an assignment is not turned in at the time it is asked for, it is considered late.

Same Day An assignment turned in after the time it is requested but before the end of the school day will receive ~~no~~ 10 point deduction.

1 day late 20 point deduction

2 days late 30 point deduction

After 2 days, the grade will become a zero and the assignment may not be accepted. Teachers may choose not to accept homework after a major exam is given over that unit (so long as it is not conflicting with the makeup grace period for absences).

Students taking a dual credit class may be subjected to the due dates set by Amarillo College. Ascension facilitators and instructors may not have the ability to accept late work if that date is determined by course requirements.

Middle School

If an assignment is not turned in at the time it is asked for, it is considered late.

Same Day or 1 day late An assignment that is turned in after the time it is requested up to one calendar day later will receive a 10 point deduction.

2 days late 20 point deduction

3 days late 30 point deduction

After 3 days, the grade will become a zero and the assignment may not be accepted. Teachers may choose not to accept homework after a ~~major~~ ~~assignment~~ over that unit (so long as it is not conflicting with the makeup grace period for absences).
