

THE TYPICA SERVICE

*Prior to the start of the service, the Reader shall locate the **Dismissal (Troparion) Hymn** and the **Kontakion Hymn** of the feast, to be found in the Great Horologion.*

The Reader should also note the Prokeimenon and Alleluia verses, listed on pages 11–13.

The Third and Sixth Hour may immediately precede the Typica.

Reader: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, Lord Jesus Christ Our God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

Glory to Thee, O God, glory to Thee.
O Heavenly King, the Comforter, the Spirit of Truth
Who art everywhere present and fillest all things,
Treasury of blessings, and Giver of Life,
Come and abide in us, cleanse us from every stain,
and save our souls O Good One.

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us.

(Thrice)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

renewed as the eagle's.

The Lord performeth deeds of mercy, and executeth judgment
for all them that are wronged.

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst after righteousness,
for they shall be filled.
Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.
Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.
Blessed are the peacemakers,
for they shall be called the sons of God.
Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake,

(Which is said or sung together, by all)

the Only-begotten, begotten of the Father before all ages;
Light of Light, true God of true God;
begotten, not made; of one essence with the Father, by Whom
all things were made;

Who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven,
and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and became man;
And was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate, suffered and was buried;
And the third day He arose again according to the Scriptures;
And ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of the Father;
And He shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead;
Whose kingdom shall have no end.
And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of life; Who proceeds from the Father;
Who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified; Who spake by the prophets.

KONTAKION

(The Kontakion of the day or feast is sung)

Reader: Lord, have mercy. *(Twelve times)*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

PSALM 33

(This is read by the Reader, or sung)

I will bless the Lord at all times, * His praise shall continually be in my mouth. * In the Lord shall my soul be praised; * let the meek hear and be glad.

O magnify the Lord with me, * and let us exalt His name together. * I sought the Lord, and He heard me, * and delivered me from all my tribulations.

Come unto Him, and be enlightened, * and your faces shall not be ashamed. * This poor man cried, and the Lord heard him, * and saved him out of all his tribulations.

The angel of the Lord will encamp round about them that fear Him, * and will deliver them. * O taste and see that the Lord is good; * blessed is the man that hopeth in Him.

O fear the Lord, all ye His saints; * for there is no want to them that fear Him. * Rich men have turned poor and gone hungry; * but they that seek the Lord shall not be deprived of any good thing.

FOR THE HOLY ANGELS

Prokeimenon (Tone 4) He maketh His angels spirits / and His ministers a flame of fire.

Verse: Bless the Lord, O my soul; O Lord my God, Thou hast been magnified exceedingly.

Alleluia. (Tone 2)

Praise the Lord from the Heavens, praise Him in the highest.

Verse: Praise Him, all ye His angels; praise Him, all ye His hosts.

FOR SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

Prokeimenon (Tone 7) The righteous man shall be glad in the Lord, and shall hope in Him.

Verse: Hearken, O God, unto my voice when I make supplication unto Thee.

Alleluia. (Tone 4)

The righteous man shall flourish like a palm tree, and like a cedar in Lebanon shall he be multiplied.

Verse: They that are planted in the house of the Lord, in the courts of our God they shall blossom forth.

FOR THE MOTHER OF GOD

Prokeimenon. (Tone 3) My soul doth magnify the Lord, and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Saviour.

Verse: For He hath looked upon the lowliness of His handmaiden; for behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed.

Alleluia. (Tone 8).

Hearken, O daughter, and see, and incline thine ear; and forget thine own people and thy father's house; and the King shall greatly desire thy beauty.

Verse: The rich among the people shall entreat thy countenance.

FOR THE HOLY APOSTLES

Prokeimenon. (Tone 8) Their sound hath gone forth into all the earth, and their words unto the ends of the world.

Verse: The heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament proclaimeth the work of His hands.

Alleluia. First Tone.

The Heavens shall confess Thy wonders, O Lord, and Thy truth in the congregation of the saints.

Verse: God Who is glorified in the council of the saints is great and terrible towards all those that are round about Him.

**PROKEIMENA AND ALLELUIA
FOR MAJOR FEASTS & VARIOUS SAINTS**

FOR THE CROSS

Prokeimenon. (Tone 7) Exalt ye the Lord our God, and worship the footstool of His feet; for He is holy.

Verse: The Lord is king, let the peoples rage; He sitteth on the Cherubim, let the earth be shaken.

Alleluia. First Tone.

Remember Thy congregation which Thou hast purchased from the beginning.

Verse: God is our king before the ages. He hath wrought salvation in the midst of the earth.

FOR PROPHETS

Prokeimenon. (Tone 4) Thou art a priest for ever, after the order of Melchisedek.

Verse: The Lord said unto my Lord: Sit Thou at My right hand, until I make Thine enemies the footstool of Thy feet.

Alleluia. (Tone 5) Moses and Aaron among His priests, and Samuel among them that call upon His Name.

Verse: A light hath dawned forth for the righteous man, and gladness for the upright of heart.

FOR A HIERARCH

Prokeimenon. (Tone 1) My mouth shall speak wisdom, and the meditation of my heart shall be of understanding.

Verse: Hear this, all ye nations; give ear, all ye that inhabit the world.

Alleluia. (Tone 2) The mouth of the righteous shall meditate wisdom and his tongue shall speak of judgment.

Verse: The law of his God is in his heart, and his steps shall not be tripped.

FOR SEVERAL HIERARCHS

Prokeimenon. (Tone 7) Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints.

Verse: What shall I render unto the Lord for all that He hath rendered unto me?

Alleluia. (Tone 1) Thy priests shall be clothed with righteousness, and Thy righteous shall rejoice.

Verse: For the Lord hath elected Sion, He hath chosen her to be a habitation for Himself.

FOR RIGHTEOUS FATHERS, AND FOOLS FOR CHRIST

Prokeimenon. (Tone 7) Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saints.

Prokeimenon. (Tone 4) Wondrous is God in His saints, even the God of Israel.

Verse: In congregations bless ye God, the Lord from the well-springs of Israel.

Alleluia. (Tone 1)

With patience I waited patiently for the Lord, and He was attentive unto me, and He hearkened unto my supplication.

Verse: And He set my feet upon a rock, and He ordered my steps aright.

FOR UNMERCENARIES

Prokeimenon. (Tone 4) In the saints that are in His earth hath the Lord been wondrous.

Verse: I beheld the Lord ever before me, for He is at my right hand, that I might not be shaken.

Alleluia. (Tone 2) Behold now, what is so good or so joyous as for brethren to dwell together in unity?

Verse: For there the Lord commanded the blessing, life for evermore.
