


The Value of Patient-Centricity in Life Sciences

doctors.1




Throughout the journey, there are often several stops with various specialties – each with a potential for misdiagnoses.

In the United States, 12 million people are affected by medical diagnostic errors each year.²


Comparing patients with similar treatment journeys can help identify opportunities to suggest alternative treatment options that may limit the number of misdiagnoses and improve patient outcomes.
