Successes at the Easter show



To promote public awareness and appreciation of fine woodwork, the association provides three cash prizes as an encouragement for members of the public to enter their woodwork in the Arts and Crafts competitions held at the Sydney Royal Easter Show each year.

The competitions we sponsor are small furniture item predominantly in wood, wooden box work and a musical instrument, predominantly in wood.

This year, association member Leon Van Vliet won first prize in the small furniture competition. Leon entered his round steambent walnut side table - a first attempt at steam bending! The top consists of 19 x 3mm laminates which he made in three pieces and joined with floating tenons.

Another association member, Miko Nakamura, was runner-up to Leon with her fumed European oak veneered sewing box with a marquetry lid.

Last meeting's speaker

We were enthralled at the association's 4 April 2016 general meeting as we enjoyed an informative talk by professional member and renowned woodworker Darren Oates on a chair making jig he recently designed and made.

Darren discussed and demonstrated how the jig helps take a lot of the guess-work out of chair design.

Using the jig means he no longer has to build a mock-up of a new chair to ensure it will be comfortable and that its design and looks will meet the needs of his clients. This saves time and costs. The jig is very versatile with many

components and thus can be used to a help with the design of a wide range of chairs including larger chairs with head rests and even chaise lounges.

Darren also displayed and discussed his Apollonius chair he recently designed and made using the jig. Timbers used are blackheart sassafras, northern silky oak and bendy plywood.

The chair, with its three curved laminated ellipses and curved laminated legs, reflects his highorder skills in using curved laminated forms in furniture construction.



Create from a crate winner



The people's choice

This year, 590
people voted
in the People's
Choice Award and
the clear winner
was our member
Alex Springall with
his exquisite marquetry cabinet.

First launched in 2002, the Victorian Woodworkers Association in partnership with Waste Converters Recycling have run six highly successful competitions.

Every year hundreds of thousands of crates and pallets containing goods and components from all over the world are imported into Australia.

Much of this packaging ends up in landfill, and it is estimated that over 500,000 tonnes of timber waste is disposed of each year in Victoria, enough to fill the MCG 1.5 times. The exhibition was conceived by Ward Petherbridge, from Waste Converters Recycling as a way of educating the community about wood-packaging waste.

The site processes around 20,000 tonnes of timber waste annually and much of the timber processed is from exotic foreign timber species. Some of these include oak, cherry, maple and elm.

On-site his company repairs and re-purposes a significant volume of timber pallets, but a large proportion still gets pulverised into low-grade mulch. Ward approached the Victorian Woodworkers Association to collaborate on the Create from a Crate Competition and jointly they aim to change people's attitudes towards timber waste.

The competition provides the incentive for individual wood designers and crafts people to design and construct functional or artistic objects from this often overlooked timber resource.

We have had another successful year, which has included:

- Our second exhibition in two years at the Lane Cove Gallery
- Six members exhibiting at the *Create from a Crate* exhibition in Melbourne. Exhibits by Brent Gerstle, Peter Harris and Alex Springall sold. In addition to a successful sale, Alex won the Peoples Prize.
- A fully booked French polishing course, which took place at Lidcombe TAFE
- A fully booked box-making course held in our workshop and run by Alex Springall, ably assisted by Peter Harris.

At the *Timber and Working with Wood Show* we had a busy time with demonstrations, advice and work made by members.

We were able this time to offer some of our work for sale. By

offering a cut-price angle-mag device as an incentive to join the association, we gained another 50 members. We financed, judged and presented prizes to the best of the school HSC woodwork pieces, which were of a very high standard.

At the end of our financial year the membership as at 31 December 2015 stood at 173.

Our joint meeting and barbeque with the *New South Wales Wooden Boat Association* was a great success. We were able to show many of their members round the workshop.

We have a lot in common with their members and we aim to repeat the BBQ in 2016. It is held at our Abbotsford workshop and I would encourage all to turn up and share the get-together.

Brent Gerstle, Peter Harris, Peter Dunn and I joined the Traditional Tools Group demonstration. We were disappointed with the turnout of the public. For much of the time, the demonstrators outnumbered the viewers.


