HATCHERY REPORT

First, it should be noted for new members, the fish culture station is operated by about twenty dedicated volunteers. Many more volunteers raised the twenty five thousand dollars needed to run the hatchery annually. The main contributors to this amount of money was the memberships, the Sportsmen Show and the Sarnia Salmon Derby. A garage sale on Mackinac Weekend also raised a thousand dollars.

A special thanks to all the hatchery operators and the people who worked on these events. We should also let you know that about thirty member of the club received special recognition from the Ministry of Natural Resources for their extra effort and many hours spent in establishing and maintaining the fish culture station.

The stock out trailer was very busy in the spring putting about 200,000 salmon and in the fall 20,000 good sized rainbow trout in local streams, bays and basins. The new large rainbow tank worked extremely well and we couldn't have raised the amount and the 60-90 gram fish without it.

The rainbow program had a set-back when approximately 20,000 eyed-up rainbow had to be replaced.

This first trial at raising this number of rainbows also caused the hatchery to operate for a full year. This put a strain on the budget as hydro and extra feed was needed from May to October. Subsequently the schedule for raising rainbow will be altered to allow for a shut down of the operation from mid May to early September to conserve funds.

Your membership and support of the other Bluewater Anglers events is our take and replace program.

We thank you, the fish thank you and you will be thanking yourself when you bring home "the big ones".

1994 is now upon us and on behalf of the BLUEWATER ANGLERS all the best to you and yours for a great year!! Our Hatchery has recently completed a full one year cycle with the expansion of the Rainbow Program in the Fall of 1992. In November/93, the Rainbow Trout (some 25,000) were released into the various waters of Lambton County. The very dedicated group who worked all through the summer to ensure the success of this program were really pleased with the outcome - excellent quality fish and very few mortalities. Success does have its price sometimes and the cost to run the Hatchery 365 days a year is just overwhelming. Electricity and food costs were very high but the results were excellent. We'll be re-working a few ideas as the Hatchery goes back to a 9-10 month operation and we gear our Rainbow and Salmon programs to what this Club can realistically manage. The time and energy spent by the volunteers in this facility is immeasurable. They all deserve a pat on the back and your continued support. Feel free to help any time!! Saturday afternoons are always a busy time - come down and check it out. IT IS YOUR CLUB!

As I pass on the "Fish Gavel", I look back on a busy year. This Club has a high profile both locally and beyond and I have been proud to represent us. I did my best to promote our Club and our Hatchery and have tried to open some new doors to ensure our continued success. We have dealt with some delicate issues - as always happens in any organization, but I think your 1993 Board of Directors has done a good job and I thank them all for their support to me and the Club.

Challenges are here for 1994 and beyond and I urge you to become involved in your Board. Elections are this month at the ANNUAL MEETING. No experience required - just a willingness to participate and take part!! There will also be information concerning some possible amendments to our Bylaws and input from the members will be requested, so please come out. These amendments will help us in our financial future and hopefully give some relief from our "Fiscal Constraint" we are under. I hope I have served my term well - I know there were skeptics but I think I proved them wrong! Anyhow, I did my best. I thank those who have helped me and the club through their time, energy, labour and other various talents. I would also like to thank Rob and my kids, Rachael and Jeremy for their support and patience throughout the year. Family priorities will limit my time this year to working on the Derby, but if we all do a little bit then the load is lighter and the results are great. Get your family involved or if you have to, get someone else's family involved. Fresh air, good company, lots of stories and an appreciation for the outdoors is good for us all.

Thanks again - it's been a good year! Hope to see you on the Water. 18th ANNUAL SARNIA SALMON DERBY The 1994 sixteen day event runs from April 30th to May 15th and is once again part of the 1994 Heritage Fishing Series.

The Sarnia Salmon Derby Committee has been meeting since last September to make this spring's derby the best one yet. Our goals are to raise upwards to \$75,000, in prizes, to have over 2,000 participants and to raise over \$11,000, for our hatchery program.

With the completion of our new rainbow facility, the hatchery is now operating year round and expenses have almost doubled to \$25,000. per year. In order to increase derby profits, this year's derby committee will be tightening it's belts on derby expenses. To reduce derby expenses we have decided to drop the boat/motor/trailer package and revert back to the old format of providing 9.9 h.p. OMC motors as first place prizes in both the salmon and trout categories. Response from all derby sponsors to date has been quite positive. Presently we are looking into

purchasing three fiberglass canoes from Abbott Boats Inc. and fishing vacation packages, as additional prizes. More detailed information will be made available at January's meeting.

The bottom line is the Sarnia Salmon Derby and Sportsmen Show have to show a \$25,000, profit to enable us to run our hatchery successfully.

Committee organizers will be looking for volunteers to help in such activities as weighing-in fish, working display booths, ticket sales, etc.

Remember that all profits go directly into our fish hatchery operating expenses. If the numbers of fish caught during last years derby is any indication, this Spring's Sarnia Salmon Derby could be the best one ever.

The last year has been a busy time for our hatchery personnel. In August of '92, they completed the construction of our new rainbow facility. In April of this year they stocked out 200,000 chinook salmon and last month released our first batch of 25,000 rainbow trout.

It is important that local fishermen come to realize that the Bluewater Anglers stocking program is based on the efforts of it's volunteers.

In all, over 50 volunteers are responsible for sustaining this areas sports fishery by donating their spare time to collect eggs, rear and release salmon and trout into lower Lake Huron waters.

During this same weekend our second annual garage sale was another success story raising over \$700. Dave Laird did a great job organizing this event and special thanks to all the club members who donated item for this sale.


HATCHERY REPORT

Summer is almost over and activity in the hatchery is beginning to pick up. A group is working to get things into shape for the next season, which should start about mid September.

Each season there is a small turnover of hatchery operators, in fact at least three have moved out of the area. Hatchery operators will be looking for club members who would be interested in learning and participating in rearing fish and running the hatchery operation. As a volunteer, you will be assigned to a team which has a one day a week commitment, starting in October and finishing by mid May. Hatchery operators spend an average of one hour on their specific day a week commitment, and each team works out what is the best time for them to work at the hatchery.

For more details about this or any questions about hatchery operations, how we do it, why, when or where, please come to the September 13, membership meeting and we can answer your questions either from the floor or in person.

BROWN TROUT FISHING On the Rise!

During last spring's derby, anglers registered the highest numbers of brown trout (214) in derby history.

The real hot spot for browns was area waters from Bright's Grove to Port Franks. Most of the action occurred while trolling in shallow water with body bait type lures. Ranking second was the St. Clair River area between Corunna and the Bluewater Bridge. Shore and pier fishermen who were doing best were fishing spawn on bottom or cast 2/5 oz. spoons like krocodile stubbies.

Most of the browns caught during last springs period were under 5 pounds and things look good for the years to come.

Presently browns have moved into the elevator slip area and are being caught by casting small silver/blue spoons or using a worm and bobber combination.

1995 SALMON DERBY

Starting September the 19th, 1994 the 1995 - 19th Annual Samia Salmon Derby Committee will start to put the gears in motion for next spring's fishing event, which runs from April 29th - May 14th, 1995. During this meeting we will be looking for someone to chair the derby and committee people to head up and co-ordinate the various activities. Hatchery Report

In October several members journeyed to AuSauble Falls and Owen Sound for our annual Salmon egg gathering. The time of the trip and full run of the salmon didn't quite coincide this year. The group had to work extremely hard to fill our quota of 200,000.

On December 31, Larry Doan and John King travelled to Thamesford and the Wildcat Trout Farm to bring back 25,000 eyed up rainbow eggs. This trip was a bit too timely as the rainbow blessed event started the next day.

Both species are now swimming in their tanks and have begun to take starter food. The rainbow as was last year are doing extremely well.

A power failure, coupled with the failure of the water pumps to kick-in when the emergency generator activated, caused the water level in the tanks to drop. This lower level seems to have stressed the salmon particularly and we are waiting to see if there are any adverse effects from this event.

For you members and your family who wish to tour the fish culture station, March 5th and 6th are open house days, with guided tours.

Our hatchery, as a completely volunteer operation is highly praised by other organizations and the Ministry of Natural Resources. During the Mackinac weekend may local residents toured the hatchery and the common remarks were "I've lived around here (Sarnia, Point Edward) for many years and didn't even know this existed and I'm quite impressed; it is very interesting".

Come on out to the Blue Building under and just north of the Bluewater Bridge and see for yourself.
