### Tu B'Shvat

This week, the students celebrated Tu B'Svhvat, the Jewish holiday occurring on the 15th day of the Hebrew month of Shevat. It is also called Rosh HaShanah La'llanot, literally 'New Year of the Trees'. In contemporary Israel, the day is celebrated as an ecological awareness day, and trees are planted in celebration. The children learnt to identify the various parts of the tree and its value to us and to the animals. The learning compares Rosh Ha'Shana, humans New Year, and Tu B'Shvat, the trees' New Year. The students were taught which of the fruits growing in Israel compose the Seven Species, and which mitzvot (laws) and customs are observed on Tu B' Shvat.

The students also studied the various cycles existing in the world through the senses, with a special emphasis on the cycle of growth. Through the blessings and customs linked to each cycle, the students gained an understanding of how Judaism instructs us to treat the environment. The unit expands the study of the blessings applying to various plants, and teaches the children how to categorise these plants in different ways.

In culmination of the topic, all students celebrated by having a Seder represented by the different fruits we eat, their blessings and meaning. Every child also got to make their own plant to symbolise continuity in the cycle of a tree. Various activities were planned and enjoyed by all classes in celebration of Tu B'shvat. The students went home with a special cupcake treat, since no Jewish Festival ends without some kind of food treat.

### **Interfaith Week**

As part of our mission to build meaningful ties with all, the whole school community has taken part in learning about different faiths to promote the aims of enhancing mutual understanding, harmony and cooperation among all people.

Across the school, learning has been meaningful and vibrant. We've been delighted to host parents as guest speakers to talk to their children's classes about their faith, traditions and festivals, and give children an opportunity to ask questions. Student driven research projects have been carried out on diverse themes from exploring the power of prayer to finding out about and presenting on different faiths. Students have been expressing themselves through poetry, artwork and song.

At the end of the week, this creativity has manifested in a visually stunning Interfaith Display in our Heart Space, collaboratively created by the Primary School grades, and a Whole School Interfaith Assembly featuring outstanding song performances from K1 and K2 (on unity), Grade 2 Laurel (on different faiths), and poetry readings from students in Grade 4.

We were humbled to host an honoured guest, Ms. Magdeline Tan from the Ministry of Home Affairs, for our Whole School Assembly. Ms. Tan was deeply moved and impressed by the assembly, and invited the school to visit the Harmony in Diversity Gallery at the Ministry of National Development.

Our Assembly culminated in a crucial question: What can we do to ensure interfaith harmony? Our children and young people gave heartfelt responses revealing wisdom beyond their years.

### **Chingay Parade Participation**

The Chingay Parade is a uniquely Singaporean tradition; it is one of Asia's largest street performances and float parades, a colourful epitome of the country's multi-cultural society, drawing an audience of around 30000 people.
