

## BUKHARA MARKHOR HUNTING IN TAJIKISTAN

### HUNTING SEASON

October – February. Best time: November – January

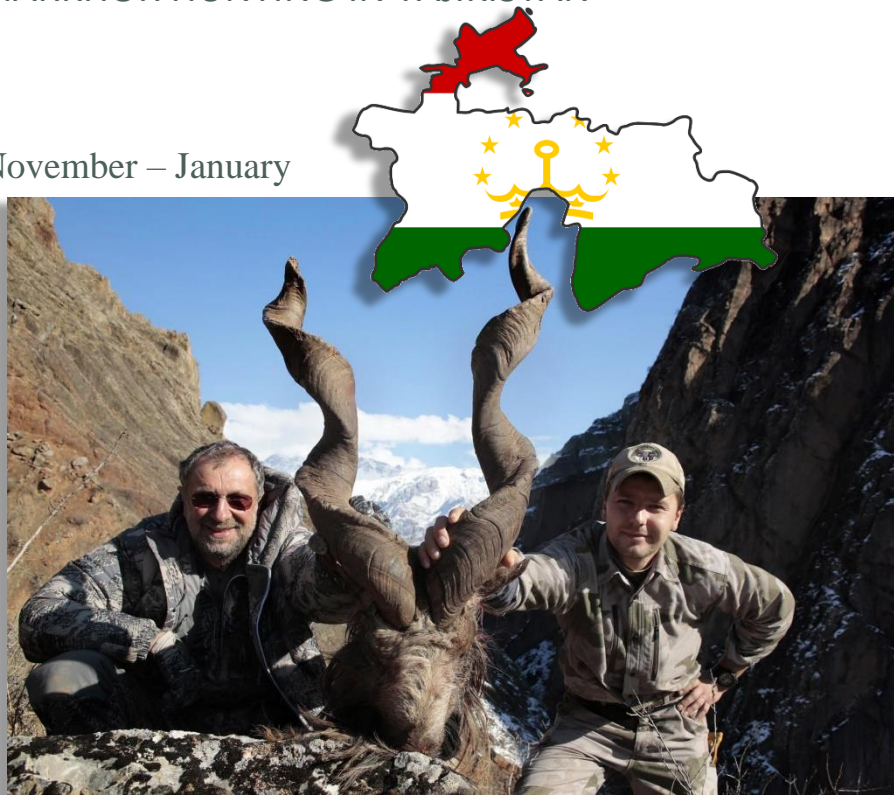
### ROUTE

Day 1 Arrival to Dushanbe. Car transfer to the Markhor hunting area.

(about 4.5 hours in total: 2.5 hours by the highway and about 2 hours by the dirt road on a 4x4 vehicle)

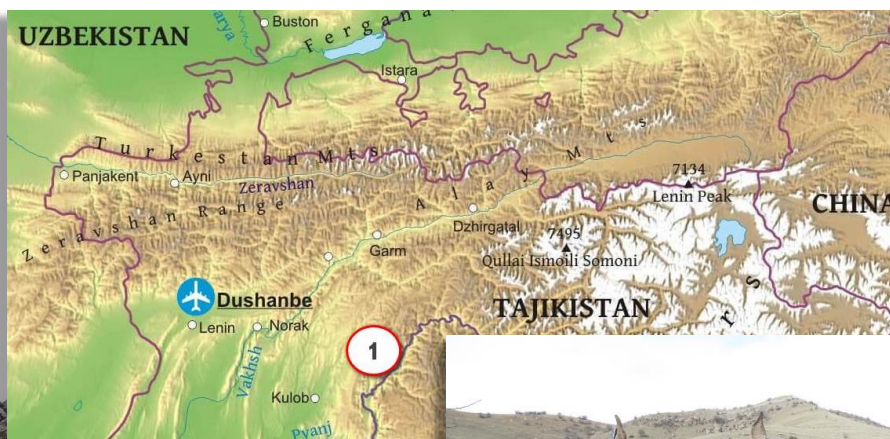
Day 2-6 5-day hunt for Markhor

Day 7 Transfer back to Dushanbe, flight back home or stay overnight at local hotel

## HUNTING

Markhor hunting is taking place at low altitudes of 4.900-5.250 feet (1.500-1.600 meters). As a rule, Markhors tend to prefer sheer cliffs of sandstone areas. The hunter is usually approaching the animal by stalking from the bottom of the mountain or by climbing and staying at the opposite cliff. Sometimes there is a need to stay at fly camp for 1-3 days.



## ACCOMMODATION

The hunters are accommodated at the guesthouses in local villages within the hunting regions. Sometimes 1 or 2 overnights in tent camp up in the mountains might be required.

5-day hunting, incl. 1 Bukhara Markhor up to 105 cm	USD 147 000
Extra fees per 1 cm for Bukhara Markhor over 105 cm	USD 4 000
5-day hunting, incl. 1 Bukhara Urial of any size	USD 55 000
Non hunter fees	USD 3 900

**Included:** meet & greet at the airport; Stalker Group PH or interpreter per every group/camp; gun import permit; transportation to/from the hunting region and in the area; accommodation and meals in the camp during the hunt; local PH; trophy fee; all serving staff in the camp; trophy field care.

**Extra costs:** hunting license – USD 2 000 Markhor or Urial (non-refundable and paid before the hunt), visa; international airfare; VIP-service in airport – USD 150 per entrance; hotel and meals in Dushanbe before and after the hunt; CITES; dip&pack; trophy shipment; tips.

*Possibility of shooting and editing a professional film during the hunt.*

*\$4000 + cameraman's expenses for plane tickets and stay in the country.*
