# STEPOVAK BEAR CAMP



**OUR BROWN BEAR AREAS ON THE PENINSULA** are producing some fabulous trophies and providing some great opportunities for world class bears. The location of Stepovak camp is geographically the most ideal setting for hunting, fishing, and recreation with the use of boats, aircraft, argo, and ATV's. Bear density is high in our areas, which are registration hunts not draw tags, and we consistently harvest some of the largest Brown Bears taken each season. With some camp locations, it may be optional to combine fall bear hunting with fishing directly at the camp or from Stonewood Lodge in Lake Clark on conclusion of the hunt. We also offer bear hunts in other areas in Alaska with some places open for 2 bears per hunter.

**WE HUNT BOTH SPRING AND FALL SEASONS**, alternating depending on the year. Most flights leave Anchorage to our camps, making it easy for our hunters and their gear. Accommodations at camps vary from cabins or deluxe style tents with filling meals featuring cooked specialty dishes and supplemented with vegetables and fruit. You can also be assured we'll cook up any freshly caught fish or seafood and supply some smoked salmon and wild game sausage. We use the most up to date and proven equipment and gear and provide our hunters with detailed information and gear list in the months prior to their hunt. Every detail matters to us and we take extra care to provide an incredible and memorable hunt.

# ARCHERY BEAR HUNTS

*Joe (my guide) had a super vantage point and right away we started seeing bears.* One we tried for about 2 miles away. We got up about half way there and saw another bear coming towards us. I knocked up an arrow, looked up, and he was right there about to walk into an opening at about 15 yards. I could see it was a big bear and just before the bear stepped into the open, Joe said "there's a cub". When she got to the opening she saw us, roared, and charged. She only came about 5 yards as we were yelling at her and turned and ran off with her cub. That was the end of that day until we were woken up at about 12 o'clock by a bear roaring close to our tent. The next morning we went up to our vantage point, looked things over, and saw the bears in similar places they were in the day before just feeding on salmon so we stuck to the same hunting strategy. We had to get past a couple of sows with cubs and at one point we had bears on both sides of us. We also saw several single bears. We ended up on the point we were trying to get to the day before and as we stood there, a sow with 2 cubs stepped in the water about 20 yards below us. She continued up river and we watched as a single bear traveling down river got too close to her and she chased him to the other riverbank. To our surprise the single bear circled back right to where we were. As it turned out, the bear came into an opening and I had a 25 yard shot. Suddenly, the sow that chased him off before was running full tilt to chase him off her fishing hole! This got his attention and I got into shooting position. He turned to face her which gave me a quartering away shot- I took it and it was a good hit. He spun around a few times, ran to the river and started floating with the current. The sow ran past the dead bear and was coming toward us so Joe fired a warning shot. She decided it would be best to turn around and collect her cubs and leave. While all this is going on, my bear is floating down the river and we aren't sure where it is. Joe went and got the packs that the sow ran over during her charge and then we started looking for the bear, finding him a quarter mile down river. Every thing went well after that, but we still were seeing bears around us. As we worked on the bear, we looked around from time to time to make sure we weren't being moved in on. Joe and I both have memories of those moments for the rest of our lives." — David M.

*"As I watched my bear go down 25 yards away, I turned to my guide and shouted 'You've got to be kidding me, you've got to be kidding me!', only to see a second bear stand up right behind us about 5 yards away.* It was the first day of Brown Bear Season on the Alaska Peninsula, and I had just killed a Pope and Young bear with my bow. It was our third day in camp, and we had seen 25 bears in the two days of scouting prior to opening day, but I was still shocked that I had actually killed at 9:30 am on the first day of the season. My guide leveled his rifle at the second bear, and we started to slowly back away. Thankfully, after a bit of yelling and a shot fired over its head, he turned and ran off. I want to thank Preston and his guys for helping me achieve my goal of killing a trophy brown bear with a bow. Preston is extremely professional and detailed-oriented, the Alaska Peninsula is truly a wild and beautiful place, and to is definitely LOADED with bears!" — Mike W.

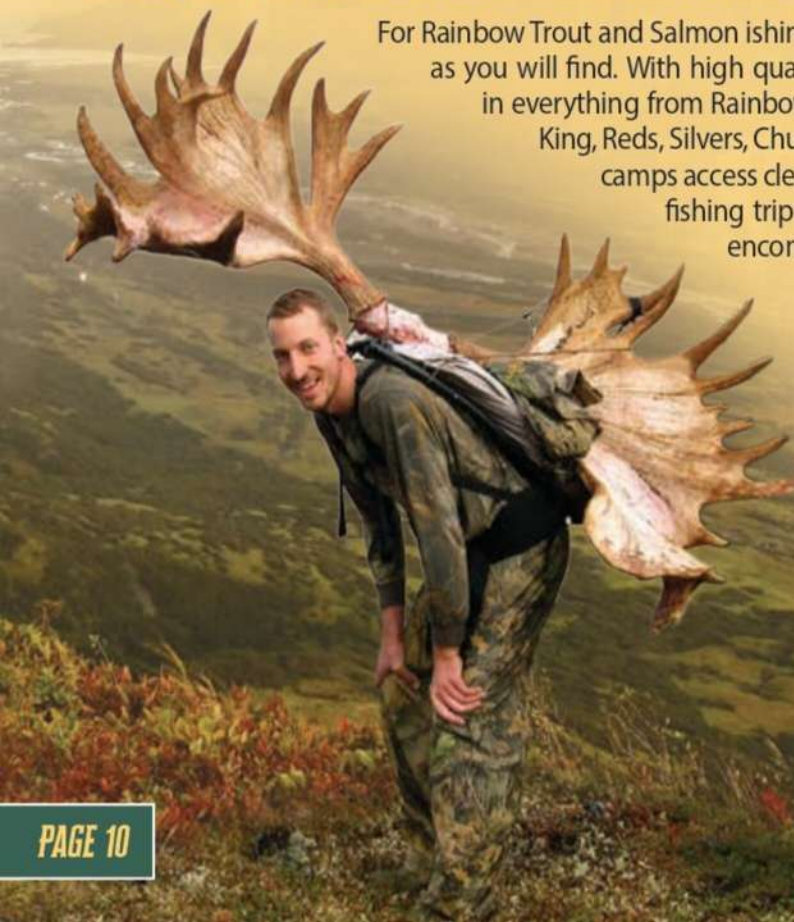
# MARABOU LANDING/SWIFTWATER



**BASED WITHIN THE BRISTOL BAY WATERSHED**, Marabou Landing is a 45 year old wilderness river camp in the heart of southwest Alaska offering a range of amenities, including historic log cabins with wood stoves, full kitchen, sauna/hot showers, and generator power. Stonewood Lodge is the perfect staging point for Marabou- we have our own aircraft to fly to the camp and connect you to a daily air service back to Anchorage.

Marabou and Swiftwater are great starting points for Moose hunts, serving as functional base camps for the area. Moose here are genetically some of the largest, creating a stately mount hanging over your fireplace mantel. Our hunters average between 62-67in and occasionally 70in- we hold the #4 B&C Moose with others in the top 40. Combine Moose with Bear or add on guided fishing days. We use the most up to date equipment and gear and provide hunters with detailed information and gear list in the months prior to the hunt. These camps are premium for large SCI Grizzly and score as nice average trophies B&C. (For the largest of the Brown Bears, hunt our Alaska Peninsula camp.) For Grizzly, bear density is high and we consistently harvest an average of 8ft bears, with 8.5-9ft possible. Hunting in Alaska can be intense from spotting, stalking, hiking, spiking out (depending on your hunt), gearing up and will give a sense of accomplishment. We've lived and hunted in this region around 27 years and are committed to provide our hunters with success. All trophies accompany you back to Anchorage and your expeditor. Both Moose and Bear from this region create a stunning taxidermy mount.

For Rainbow Trout and Salmon fishing in Alaska, this is as remote and pristine a trophy destination as you will find. With high quality fishing, the surrounding tributaries will keep you reeling in everything from Rainbows to Salmon. All species of Salmon are in the area, including King, Reds, Silvers, Chum, and Pinks with Grayling and Arctic Char plentiful daily. Both camps access clear water and gravel bottom rivers- prime fish habitat. Combine fishing trips at these camps with fishing at Stonewood Lodge for an all encompassing Alaska experience. Rafting is also available.

# STEPOVAK MOOSE CAMP



**WE'VE ALL IMAGINED HUNTING A LARGE ALASKAN MOOSE**, watching as he lazily grazes through marshy ground moving his majestic set of antlers back and forth. With a few grunts and calls however, he is immediately at attention and makes the heart rate jump as you ready yourself for the shot. Our Stepovak Moose Camp is a private concession on the Alaska Peninsula, situated in some of the best Moose habitat around. Our clients are the only guided hunters in the area and we have proactively managed our hunts for the last 15 years, creating strong numbers of the moose population as a whole and countless older mature bulls. We conduct our hunts in September each year and use the argo's and ATV's for ground transportation in the area. Most hunts are based from a cabin but doing an overnight in a deluxe tent back in the moose rutting valley has proven very beneficial for early morning harvest the next day. We take limited numbers of hunters for this Registration hunt area (Not Draw) and it's a perfect trip for a couple hunting buddies, father/son, etc. This is also a great place to combine in some fishing or wolf hunting.

# MT. GOAT • BLACK BEAR • DALL SHEEP • SITKA DEER



**FOR MOUNTAIN HUNTS OF DALL SHEEP AND GOAT,** no matter the age or ability of the hunter, we work together to provide a hunt tailored to each persons capability. We do not require our hunters to carry a heavy backpack - most use a small backpack, hip pack, or nothing at all. Sheep hunts are conducted in August to early September and Mountain Goat hunts from September through part of November. On some hunts it may be possible to hunt coastal bear or grizzly on a trophy fee basis. Mountain Goat hunters use the main boat, Landing craft, and/or Float Plane.

For Black Bear and Black Tail Deer hunts, we offer a boat based hunt-best for groups of 3-4 people. Schedule the boat for the amount of days you wish to deer hunt. The larger boat or landing craft is used for Black Bear, along with a smaller Zodiac or Lund for the actual stalks.

All trophies taken on a hunt are professionally prepared and cared for and accompany you back to Anchorage and your Expiditor. For Dall Sheep and Mountain Goat, we highly recommend a life size mount. A Black Bear can also male a great life size mount as well as a nice rug.
