Some even achieve championship glory late in their careers. Yet, who holds the record for the oldest player to win the Masters? None other than golf's greatest legend, Jack Nicklaus, who at 46 years, 2 months, and 23 days old, donned the green jacket for his sixth and final time in 1986. A remarkable Sunday 65 propelled him up the leaderboard, etching one of the most unforgettable tournaments in golf history. The reaction to Nicklaus' 46-year-old triumph would have been jaw-dropping had it occurred in 1998 when he finished T6 at the ripe age of 58, a mere four strokes behind champion Mark O'Meara. With nearly nine decades of Masters history, the tournament has seen a diverse range of winners across various age groups - from their 20s to 40s. Interestingly, Tiger Woods holds the record for being the youngest player to win the Masters, claiming victory at just 21 years, 3 months, and 14 days in 1997. His first major championship win also made him the youngest green jacket winner since Seve Ballesteros' 1980 victory at age 23. The Masters is finally here, with Scottie Scheffler looking to make history as he chases his third green jacket and a possible three-time winner's club membership. Rory McIlroy aims to join the exclusive group of players who have won at Augusta National, while Bryson DeChambeau seeks his first Masters title. The Golden Masters: Oldest Golfers to Win the Tournament ===== Veterans in the Masters can still pull off surprising wins, and some have achieved remarkable success at an advanced age. Here are the oldest golfers to win the prestigious tournament. Jack Nicklaus, widely regarded as one of the greatest golfers ever, won the Masters six times and holds the record for the most major wins (18). At 46 years old, he narrowly beat out Tom Kite and Greg Norman in his final round. Tiger Woods, a dominant force in the early 2000s, won his first Masters at age 21 in 1997. Although injuries affected his career, Woods still managed to win four PGA Championships, three U.S. Opens, and three The Open Championships. Ben Crenshaw, also known as "Gentle Ben," won two majors, including the 1984 and 1995 Masters. His victory in 1995 was notable for being one of Tiger Woods' first major appearances as an amateur. Gary Player, a South African golfer, won three Masters titles and holds 159 professional wins to his credit. He competed well at 42 years old, finishing two strokes behind the leader. Sam Snead, who won 143 events in his career, took home three Masters titles. His most recent win came in 1934, when he finished tied with Ben Hogan. These golfers prove that age is just a number and that experience can still lead to success on the golf course.The playoff format back then was just an add-on to the Monday round, really. Snead sunk a 70, ending up two under par, whereas Hogan managed to stay one under par.
