The first event takes place on December 13-14, 2024, at Mt. Zion Snocross National in Ironwood, Michigan, followed by U.S. Air Force Snocross National events in Shakopee, Minnesota (January 10-11), and Deadwood, South Dakota (January 24-25). Other notable events include the Seneca Allegany Snocross National in Salamanca, New York, on February 21-22; the ERX National in Elk River, Minnesota, on March 7-8; and the U.S. Air Force Snocross National event in Eagle River, Wisconsin, on March 14-16.Notable riders returning for the 2025 season include Emil Harr, last year's Pro Class champion, who aims to defend his title, as well as Elias Ishoel, who is returning from injury and could pose a threat to Harr's reign. Crayden Dillon, the 2024 Rookie of the Year in Pro-Lite, will also be competing. The season will be broadcast on FloRacing and the FloSports App for fans to watch live and follow their favorite riders. The final standings for the 2023-2024 season of the AMSOIL Snocross Pro and Pro Lite classes have been announced.Salamanca is set to deliver an unforgettable Snocross experience at the AMSOIL Championship Snocross Triple Crown. Emil Harr continues to dominate the competition, securing his fourth overall victory of the season on Sunday. However, he was pushed to the limit by Jordan Lebel in a thrilling second round that saw both riders go head-to-head once again in the final round.Harr rode a smooth and controlled race to clinch his fourth consecutive overall win, strengthening his grip on the championship points lead. Despite this being his first podium finish in New York, Harr expressed his excitement about the event, praising the track's challenging up-and-down hills.Lebel secured second overall with consistent scores, keeping him firmly in the title hunt and second to Harr in the points standings. Meanwhile, Adam Peterson claimed his second podium of the season, while Elias Ishoel continued to fight through injury to keep his championship hopes alive.The Andersons Maple Syrup Pro Lite division is heating up, with Crayden Dillon and Anson Scheele locked in a fierce battle for the title. After a strong start to the season, Dillon faced a setback when he crashed out of contention in Valcourt due to illness, but he bounced back strongly in New York, securing his fifth win of the season.Dillon's victory ensured he remains close to Scheele in the standings, but the points leader's runner-up finish allowed him to maintain an eight-point advantage heading into Saturday. With Archambault's podium aspirations derailed by a blown belt, Martin Johansson seized the opportunity to move up the ranks and is poised for another impressive performance.Malene Cottew dominated at Bikeman Performance Pro AM Womens final, securing her fifth win of the season with a wire-to-wire performance on a technically challenging track. The defending champion's ability to maintain speed and control even as the track deteriorated was once again showcased. Cottew credited her crew for their hard work, saying "The guys on the crew work so hard on my sled... I said 'Are you sure' and they said 'Yep, let's do it.'" She took an early lead and pulled away from the pack, while behind her Inanna Hauger and Ava McCurdy engaged in a tight battle for second place. Hauger eventually gained the upper hand and settled into the runner-up spot.In other action, Andy Lieders continued his winning streak, taking his sixth consecutive victory in the Thomas Sno Sport Pro AM Plus 30 class. Former Pro rider Corin Todd made a strong debut, finishing second in his first race of the season, while Tyler Oomen secured his second consecutive podium with a third-place finish.Meanwhile, Dylan Lebel maintained his points lead in the FXR Sport category, grabbing his third win of the season after taking an early holeshot and leading every lap.
