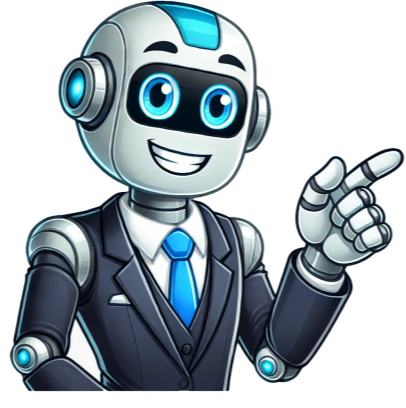

===== Elf Bowling: A Christmas Classic Turned Internet Sensation In 1998, NStorm released Elf Bowling, a unique bowling game that became an unlikely internet sensation. The game's developers, Dan Ferguson and Mike Bielinski, created it as promotional marketing content for their studio NVision Design. The game's concept is simple yet entertaining: players take on the role of Santa Claus, knocking down elves arranged like bowling pins. The twist? The elves are not happy about being used in this way, leading to some hilarious banter and interactions throughout the game. One of the most distinctive features of Elf Bowling is its use of animations and sound effects. A festive Christmas-themed frog hops around the screen, while a reindeer wanders along the bowling lane. However, hitting these distractions with the ball can have amusing consequences. The game's success was not limited to its novelty factor. In 2000, it was discovered that Elf Bowling was being distributed as an email attachment, leading to widespread concern about computer viruses. Fortunately, it was just a harmless game. In 2001, Nvision Design and its assets were acquired by Vectrix Business Solutions, which subsequently filed for bankruptcy. The company's intellectual properties, including Elf Bowling, were sold to Commotion Interactive, Inc., which has since released several sequels. The Elf Bowling series continues to entertain fans of the holiday season. Its unique blend of humor and gameplay has made it a beloved classic among gamers and non-gamers alike. Elf Bowling 3 was recently released by NStorm, a subsidiary of Commotion Interactive, featuring updated graphics and new gameplay mechanics. The game's success is a testament to its enduring appeal and the creativity of its developers. The game's scoring system relies heavily on the elves' positions on the board. Only elves that are placed after Santa and Dingle have taken their turns count towards the score. However, it is possible for an elf to be knocked off the board by another elf, and they can also be moved into higher scoring zones after contact. A unique aspect of the game is the random appearance of a bonus elf per round, indicated by a flashing bathing suit. The bonus elf is worth double or triple the throw value depending on the round number. This means that players can earn up to 800 points in the first two rounds and 1200 points in the third round. To gain additional points, players must shoot penguins and their balloons located on an iceberg. However, shooting the iceberg will cause it to sink and be removed from play. The game has undergone eight editions for Microsoft Windows, with each iteration introducing new features such as 3D graphics and a wider variety of backgrounds and elf antics. One notable edition is Elf Bowling - Bocce Style, which uses the elves as bocce balls. Another version, Elf Bowling 6: Air Biscuits, involves shooting an elf over a mound of snow to earn points. The elf can remain airborne by using "fart" power. The game also features a story mode where elves will stop at all costs to prevent Santa from rolling a strike. Santa, however, has power-ups that can hinder the elves' efforts. The original two Elf Bowling games were released for Nintendo DS and Game Boy Advance, but received negative reviews due to poor graphics, audio, and controls. A computer-animated film based on the game was released in 2007, titled Elf Bowling the Movie: The Great North Pole Elf Strike. The film features the voices of Rex Piano, Jill Talley, Tom Kenny, and Joe Alaskey, and was a co-production between the United States, Fiji, and South Korea. ===== The animated film "Elf Bowling" was released in 2008 and again as a Blu-ray disc on May 18, 2016. The movie received generally negative reviews from critics for its writing, animation, direction, humor, plot, musical numbers, voice acting, characterizations, and overall connection to the video game it is based on. Due to this poor critical reception, plans for an upcoming sequel titled "Elf Bowling 2: The Great Halloween Pumpkin-Heist" were immediately canceled. Over time, however, the movie has been parodied in a stage adaptation by Chapman University's sketch comedy group The Player's Society, which premiered in 2021 and was directed by Delaney Tobin. This performance adapts and reinterprets the original film for live audiences. It's a super silly game. You get to bowl with elves instead of bowling pins! You'll play as Santa Claus and try to knock down those mischievous elves who are causing trouble. You can play the original Elf Bowling, where you bowl strikes and spares with the elves. Or, you can try Elf Bowling 2: Elves in Paradise, where you play a shuffleboard-style game with the elves on a cruise ship. How to Play Ready to roll? Here's how to do it: - Arrow Keys: Use these to aim your shots carefully. In Elf Bowling 1, you'll use the arrow keys to line up your bowling ball just right. In Elf Bowling 2, you'll use them to aim your elf throws on the cruise ship deck. - Z: This button is your "GO!" button. In Elf Bowling 1, press Z to release the bowling ball and send it crashing into those elves. In Elf Bowling 2, press it to toss your elf down the deck. Enter: Start / Pause / Resume the game. Elf Bowling 1 You'll bowl just like in a real bowling alley, but with a few silly surprises. Watch the lane markers light up to help you aim, and try to get strikes and spares just like in real bowling. A strike means you knock down all the elves at once, and a spare means you knock them all down in two tries. But watch out for those pesky reindeer that might wander onto the lane and block your ball! And don't let those giggling elves distract you from your game. Elf Bowling 2 You'll play a game like shuffleboard but with elves as the pucks! It's a bit like air hockey, but you're sliding elves instead of a puck. Slide the elves down the deck of a cruise ship and try to land them in the scoring zones to get points. You can even get bonus points by hanging an elf off the edge of the deck - but don't let them fall into the ocean! Be careful, though; the ship is rocking back and forth, so you'll need to adjust your aim to make sure your elves land where you want them to.
