Richard Bandler is an American writer, consultant, and public speaker born in 1950 in Teaneck, New Jersey. He's known for co-creating the popular self-help technique neuro-linguistic programming (NLP) with John Grinder in the 1970s, which some consider to be pseudoscience. Bandler has a troubled past, having been beaten severely as a child and moving frequently between San Francisco and California after his parents' separation. Bandler pursued higher education, earning a BA in philosophy and psychology from University of California, Santa Cruz (UCSC) in 1973 and an MA in psychology from Lone Mountain College in San Francisco two years later. He also worked on editing projects with publisher Robert S. Spitzer, including The Gestalt Approach and Eye Witness to Therapy. Bandler's collaboration with John Grinder led to the development of The Structure of Magic in 1975. They claimed to have studied the methods of Milton Erickson and Virginia Satir to codify foundational models for NLP. However, Bandler was involved in a murder case in 1986 when his girlfriend's friend, Corine Ann Christensen, was shot dead with a .357 magnum owned by Bandler. He testified that he didn't shoot her, but authorities charged him with her murder. Richard Bandler is a renowned author and expert in the field of Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP).
