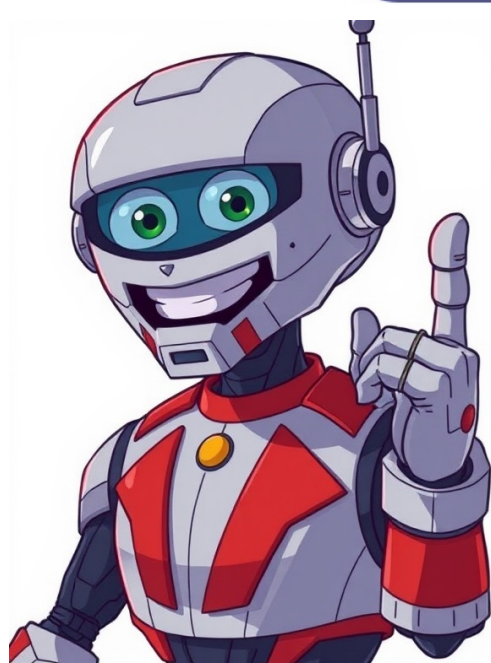


I'm not a bot























Anthony Walsh, a renowned Professor of Criminology at Boise State University, boasts an impressive resume that includes over 150 journal articles and book chapters, as well as 34 books on various criminological topics. Notably, he received his PhD from Bowling Green State University at the relatively advanced age of 43, showcasing his exceptional dedication to his field. His extensive field experience in law enforcement and corrections has provided a rich foundation for his academic pursuits. Walsh's prolific writing career includes influential works such as *Biology and Criminology* (Routledge, 2009), where he explores the complex relationship between biology and criminological theory. Other notable titles include *Feminist Criminology Through a Biosocial Lens* (Carolina Academic Press, 2011) and *The Neurobiology of Criminal Behavior: Gene-Brain-Culture Interaction* (with Jon Bolen, Ashgate, 2012), which delves into the intricate interplay between genetics, brain function, and environmental influences on criminal behavior. In addition to his academic achievements, Walsh's interests lie in biosocial criminology, statistics, and criminal justice assessment and counseling. His research endeavors aim to bridge the gap between biological and social factors that contribute to crime, ultimately informing more effective policies and interventions. Cody Jorgensen, a talented young scholar, has joined forces with Walsh as co-author of *Criminology: The Essentials* (Sage, 2015). A native Texan, Jorgensen earned his PhD in Criminology from the University of Texas at Dallas and now serves as an assistant professor in the criminal justice department at Boise State University. His expertise spans various areas within criminology, including biosocial criminology, policing and forensics, and attitudes and perceptions in crime and justice.
