High standard model b owners manual

Hi Standard Model "B" .22 Caliber Semi-Auto Pistol The Hi Standard Model B was one of the first pistols produced by the company and was derived from an earlier Browning design. The model came in both long barrel and short barrel versions. This particular model, which has a long barrel, features a reliable and accurate design. However, some users found the grip to be too short for larger hands, but later models addressed this issue by extending the grip. Additionally, the magazine capacity was increased from nine to ten rounds, and a slide lock back lever was added, which was not present in earlier models. The pistol underwent significant restoration work to repair damage to the left grip panel and side frame cover. The original panels were replaced with new ones made from walnut wood, carefully fitted to ensure proper clearance. A hand-rubbed oil finish was applied to achieve a new look that resembles the original. One of the key considerations when field stripping the Hi Standard Model B is ensuring that the little button on top of the slide is not damaged. Proper stripping and maintenance are crucial to avoid damaging the pistol. The restoration process required careful attention to detail, but the end result is a functional and restored pistol that looks like new. The model's reliability, accuracy, and aesthetic appeal make it a popular choice among firearms enthusiasts. Looking at the Hi Standard Model B, what's noticeable up front? Pulling the slide all the way back and then holding down the button allows the spring to compress while still being held by the button. You can now push the takedown lever down and slide the slide rearward to remove it. To put it back together, press the takedown lever down and slide the slide forward until it clicks into place. Release the lever and pull the slide all the way rearward to release the spring. As for how this gun performs at the range, the feel is that of a well-crafted piece of equipment. Originally designed as a plinker, it features non-adjustable sights suitable for casual shooting. While lacking target sights may be an issue in formal competitions, its accuracy makes up for it. The trigger pull is smooth and has a light, glass-like break. Good triggers are often associated with high-quality firearms like the Hi Standard. The Model B's value lies not only in its performance but also in its durability. With proper care, this gun will last for years to come, making it a worthwhile investment. Although prices may be higher than newer models, the resale value is likely to be even better.
