It is a UEFA category four stadium and has hosted various international football tournaments, such as the FIFA World Cup and the European Cup. San Siro is also set to host the opening ceremony of the 2026 Winter Olympics in Milan and Cortina.The iconic San Siro stadium boasts vertically arranged rings of spectator rows and is equipped with nineteen spiralling ramps each 200 metres long to access its upper tiers. Initially, it had a capacity of over 100,000 visitors before being reduced for security reasons to 60,000 seats and 25,000 standing areas. The stadium was named in honour of Giuseppe Meazza, one of Milan's most renowned footballers, but fans refer to it as San Siro due to its historical significance with both Inter and Milan teams. A major renovation between 1987-1990 increased the capacity to 85,000 spectators and introduced a cover, featuring distinctive red girders. The stadium has hosted numerous high-profile matches, including three Champions League knockout ties between Inter and Milan, as well as European Cup finals and UEFA Champions League matches. It also occasionally hosts Italy national team games and has been used for other notable international football competitions. However, it has not hosted a single-match final since the competition format changed in 1997-98.The San Siro stadium, home to Milan and Internazionale football clubs, has seen some significant events in its history. Back in the day, the Latin Cup was played here, but these matches took place at Arena Civica. During the COVID-19 pandemic in Italy, a UEFA Champions League match between Atalanta and Valencia on February 19th became known as "Game Zero". This game marked Atalanta's first time advancing to the Champions League round of 16 and had an impressive attendance of over 40,000 people - about one third of Bergamo's population. By March 24th, almost 7,000 people in the province of Bergamo had tested positive for COVID-19, with over 1,000 fatalities. This made Bergamo the hardest-hit region during the pandemic. In June 2019, Milan and Internazionale announced their plans to build a new stadium to replace San Siro. The proposed 60,000-capacity stadium would be constructed next to the current one and was initially expected to cost \$800 million.However, this project has faced opposition from fans of both teams. On September 26th, 2019, Milan and Internazionale released two potential designs for the new stadium. Populous' design was chosen in May 2020, but the project has been delayed several times. In December 2021, a new proposal was filed to build a 70,000-seater stadium alongside the club headquarters and museum in San Donato Milanese.Here are some notable matches played at the San Siro:* On February 20th, 1927, Milan drew 2-2 against Czechoslovakia in a friendly match with an attendance of 28,000.* On December 2nd, 1928, Milan defeated Netherlands 3-2 with a crowd of 19,000 watching.* On November 27th, 1932, Hungary was beaten by Hungary 4-2 in a friendly match with an attendance of 32,000.And many more historic matches were played at the San Siro.The stadium has hosted various international football matches, including friendly games, UEFA Euro tournaments, and FIFA World Cup qualifiers. Notable matches include Sweden's 2-0 win over Romania in 1976 and Uruguay's 1-0 victory over Spain in 1980. The stadium was also part of the 1934 FIFA World Cup, hosting three matches, and the 1990 tournament, where West Germany won the group stage.In more recent times, the stadium has hosted UEFA Euro tournaments, including the 2016 qualifying stages and the 2021 UEFA Nations League Finals, which featured Italy and Spain. The stadium was also one of the venues for the 2004 UEFA Euro qualifying stage, where Scotland defeated Switzerland 2-0.The stadium has a rich history, having hosted various other international competitions, including rugby union matches between Italy and Romania in 1987-89. Additionally, it was the venue for a boxing match in 1960 and will host the opening ceremony of the 2026 Winter Olympics co-hosted by Milan.* A test match between Italy and New Zealand was held, with 80,018 tickets sold, making it one of the highest attendances for the venue.* The All Blacks won 20-6 in this rugby union event.* Since the 1980s, San Siro stadium has hosted numerous concerts by major international artists. * Some notable performers include Bob Marley, Bob Dylan, Bruce Springsteen, Genesis, Michael Jackson, U2, Madonna, Coldplay, and Taylor Swift.The Rising Tour marked the beginning of Claudio Baglioni's concert career in 2003, followed by Vasco Rossi's Articolò 31 performance. Over the years, numerous artists performed at various venues, including U2, Ligabue, The Rolling Stones, Robbie Williams, and many others.Some notable performances include:* U2's Vertigo Tour, which featured over 137,000 attendees* Bruce Springsteen's Magic Tour, which drew a crowd of over 59,800* Madonna's Sticky & Sweet Tour, which attracted an audience of over 55,300* One Direction and 5 Seconds of Summer's Where We Are Tour, which broke records with over 115,900 attendeesThe concerts were often recorded and released as live albums or concert films. On June 9, Beyonc kicked off her Formation World Tour with Chloë x Halle, followed by Depeche Mode and Coldplay on separate tours.In 2017, Rihanna, Beyonc, Depeche Mode, and Coldplay had one-off concerts at the stadium. In 2018, J-Ax & Fedez, Cesare Cremonini, and Negramaro also performed. Ed Sheeran's Tour took place on June 28.In 2019, Vasco Rossi and Luciano Ligabue headlined their respective tours, while Beyonc and Jay-Z performed together as part of the On the Run II Tour.The stadium hosted Elton John in 2022, followed by The Rolling Stones and Guns N' Roses. In 2023, Tiziano Ferro, Coldplay, CHVRCHES, Ligabue, and Muse had their own concerts. For 2024, Vasco Rossi, Negramaro, Sfera Ebbasta, Club Dogo, and Max Pezzali performed.The stadium is located in Milan's northwestern part and can be reached by public transportation.
