These earned points will be reflected on the Army's promotion point worksheet and updated after 48-72 hours of certificate completion. You can max out at 20 promotion points in this section. Awards, decorations, and badges are included here, such as AAMs, RCOMs, Air Assault, and any other relevant badges. Take note that soldiers on current jump status get an additional 30 promotion points in the Airborne Advantage section. This is a significant perk for those who regularly jump out of planes. Moving on to professional military education, we see BLC and ALC highlighted. These are vital identifiers for moving up against your peers, with 20 points for Commandant's List in basic leadership course and 40 points for the Distinguished Leader or Distinguished Honor grad. Next, Resident Military Training Points offer four to five promotion points per week for courses like CLS, combative, and resident military training. Computer-Based Training Points are another crucial area, offering 80 promotion points for completing over 500 hours of training. This is a significant opportunity for younger soldiers to get promoted quickly through online training. Finally, civilian education is also worth noting, with two points per semester hour completed or CLEP. However, the big deal here is getting your army college credits credentialed at a college, which can grant you 30 college credits and an additional 60 promotion points. You need to review your promotion point worksheet, which shows all your sections and totals at the bottom. Your current score is 800 points, but you can aim for 798 if needed. This worksheet helps you determine how many promotion points you have, so you should learn to read it correctly.
