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Wisconsin volleyball leak pics

University of Wisconsin police are investigating how private photos and video of members of the national champion women's volleyball team were shared publicly without consent. The players contacted campus police after becoming aware that the images had been made public, with the athletic department stating their top priority is supporting the student-athletes. Most of the circulating images have since been taken down, and the team has a 13-3 record for the season. The investigation into the unauthorized sharing of private photos and video of Wisconsin's national champion women's volleyball team players is ongoing, according to the university's athletic department. The incident reportedly occurred when sensitive images were circulated publicly without consent, sparking concerns over privacy violations and potential breaches of university policies and criminal laws. Police have launched an investigation, focusing on multiple crimes including sharing private content. However, the players themselves are not being targeted as suspects. University of Wisconsin police are dealing with a complex case involving private nude photos and video of the school's women's volleyball team being leaked online. The team's executive director, Marc Lovicott, described the situation as "unique" due to the high profile of the players involved. An unspecified player's phone is believed to be the source of the explicit content, which was taken after their national championship win last December. Police are currently investigating how the photos were shared without the players' consent and who may have been responsible for leaking them online. The team has maintained its focus on the court despite the situation, with recent victories over Michigan State and Michigan. Under Wisconsin law, sharing explicit photos without permission is a crime. Private photos and videos of University of Wisconsin women's volleyball team members were leaked online, prompting an investigation by the school police. The material was reportedly shared without consent, including footage showing players in the locker room and one photo that appeared to show them lifting their sports bras. The university is investigating how this happened, with a statement saying it's "a significant and wrongful invasion of the student-athletes' privacy." Players contacted campus police after becoming aware of the leaked photos, but Wisconsin State Journal reported coach Kelly Sheffield declined to comment on whether disciplinary action would be taken against the team. The University of Wisconsin's women's volleyball team is under investigation after private videos and photos were shared online without their consent. The university's athletics department has confirmed that an investigation is underway, but assured that the student-athletes are not being investigated for wrongdoing. The images in question appear to have been taken during a game or practice, and some have been described as showing players in compromising positions. An image posted after the team won the Big Ten Title in 2021 showed players with their sports bras lifted. The department has stated that the images were "never intended to be shared publicly" and are working to support the student-athletes affected by the sharing of these images.
