With this in hand, you are allowed to drive without supervision. However, it comes with restrictions based on your age. If you are 16 years old, those restrictions are: You can't drive between 12 a.m. and 6 a.m. unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. You can't have more than one non-family passenger in the car unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. After holding the probationary license for 12 months and if you are under the age of 18, the following restrictions apply: You can't drive between 1 a.m. to 5 a.m. You can drive between those hours when accompanied by a parent or legal guardian or to and from work, and you must carry an Employer Approval for Probationary Driver License Holders. Driving Within Restricted Hours (Form BMV 2825) with you. You can also drive to school or a church event with an Event Official Approval for Probationary Driver License Holders. Driving Within Restricted Hours (Form BMV 2826). To get a full, unrestricted Ohio drivers license, the final step would be to turn 18 years old. Once a driver turns 18 in Ohio, the probationary license converts to a full, unrestricted Ohio drivers license with just the rules of the road to follow.
