Nissan CarWings, rebranded as NissanConnect in 2015, offers a vehicle telematics service to drivers in several countries, including Japan, the United States, Canada, Great Britain, and most other nations. The primary function of this service is to provide mobile connectivity for on-demand traffic information services and internet-based maps displayed inside select Nissan vehicles. Origins The CarWings service began in December 1997 with the launch of Compass Link in the 1997 Nissan Cedric, Gloria, President, Cima, Laurel, Leopard, and Elgrand models. Initially, it was offered by Compass Link Co., Ltd., which also provided this service to Mitsubishi and BMW vehicles in Japan starting January 2000. Benefits The subscription-based service replaces the need for periodic updates to in-car navigation systems that rely on CD or DVD maps, which must be updated with the latest information. Unlike other Nissan vehicles, CarWings connects to its data services through a vehicle's TCU (telematics control unit), using internet connections established by the vehicle. Services and Variations The services offered vary depending on the version of the navigation system installed in the vehicle. The feature provides the most efficient route based on various conditions between the point of departure and destination, aiming to minimize interruptions and reduce driving time. In Japan, the VICS (Vehicle Information and Communication System) service offers traffic information broadcast digitally on FM radio frequencies. This feature allows drivers to connect with an operator who can send a destination to their vehicle while it's moving. Other available services include current weather information, restaurant searches, as well as other features. The system provides live assistance in various categories if the caller is unsure of some details. Some of these services include traffic and weather updates, horoscopes, sports scores, and game status. Availability Starting September 20, 2006, CARWINGS was made available to subscribers on their home computers by registering a specific URL that offers RSS. This service began in November 2006, installed in conjunction with HDD navigation. The telemetry is uploaded via mobile phones, and the Nissan Vehicle Information Center analyzes statistical data to deliver traffic information results. The vehicle's position is complemented by the VICS service to display the fastest route. As of June 2007, vehicles like Skyline, Serena, Tiida, Latio, Wingroad, Dualis had access to this particular service. CarWings navigation system was introduced by Willcom in 2005 for their mobile phone communication services. The data connection subscription is an additional fee, which is available for ¥3,150 per year after a free period ends. The service offers various features such as hands-free phone service, AM/FM radio, and voice recognition. It also includes route search functions with real-time traffic information distribution. In 2010, the price of navigation plans was reduced to 210 yen per month for flat-rate communication. CarWings is available on most Nissan vehicles manufactured after 2004 and some Suzuki models. The system has undergone several updates over the years, including the introduction of new features such as HDD navigation in 2006. In addition to CarWings, other car manufacturers also offer their own navigation systems, including MyFord Touch, Ford Sync, Microsoft Auto, OnStar, Hyundai Blue Link, Kia UVO, and Toyota Entune. The cost of NissanConnect varies depending on the region and model year. New owners typically receive a free trial period of premium features, but ongoing subscription costs range from \$8 to \$13 per month. Some features can be subscribed to individually, while others are included for life or offer extended free services. ===== User Feedback: Love and Hate Users generally appreciate the Remote Climate Control feature, as well as Vehicle Monitoring and Simplified Checks. However, reliability problems with the app have been reported, as well as slow response times.
