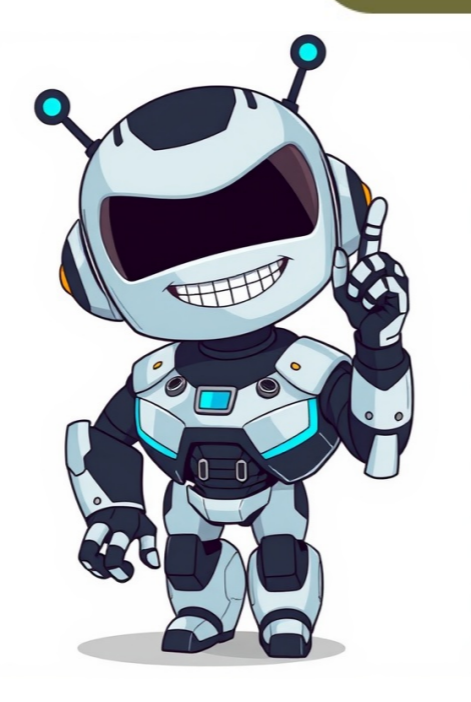

Last year's NFL quarterback hierarchy has changed, with Joe Burrow no longer considered among the top mobile options. Burrow, who finished with just 201 rushing yards last season, lacks the extra juice that quarterbacks like Josh Allen, Lamar Jackson, and Jalen Hurts bring to the table. The difference between these QBs and Burrow is evident in their rushing production - he had more games with single-digit or negative rushing yards than contests where he exceeded 20 yards on the ground. Even in a near-flawless season for playcalling, health, and efficiency, managers saw him post two games without a single touchdown pass. These factors matter significantly for fantasy managers seeking safe, steady production as well as upside. In today's high-scoring environment, mobile quarterbacks thrive on broken plays, in the red zone, and when the game script turns. Burrow needs "everything" to go right - 5,000 yards and 40-plus touchdowns - just to approach the fantasy heights hit by more mobile options like Allen and Jackson. Zay Flowers' stock is rising due to his expanding role within Todd Monken's offense, particularly in target share, which increased from 20.6% as a rookie to 24.9% last season. Flowers' positional flexibility has also become crucial, with slot usage climbing to 41.7%, showcasing his value in modern NFL offenses. Monken's trust in Flowers is evident in his willingness to move him around the formation, demonstrating recognition of his matchup potential rather than being a one-dimensional threat. ===== Looking forward to seeing everyone at the meeting tomorrow and discussing our strategies. Whoever is taking the top spot, should be going for it in PPR, Half-PPR and Standard format. ===== The Cincinnati Bengals WR Ja'Marr Chase holds court as the consensus No. 1 pick in PPR and Half-PPR leagues but Bijan Robinson and Saquon Barkley are closing in fast. In Standard formats, the spotlight shifts to the ground game and Bijan's all-purpose skill set locks him in as the No. 2 pick behind Chase. Besides Chase and Robinson, Jahmyr Gibbs is also making a strong case for Round 1 status. ===== The quarterback landscape is electrifying and fantasy managers are feeling the heat. Josh Allen narrowly takes the crown over Lamar Jackson, thanks to his relentless goal-line usage and cannon arm. Jayden Daniels is closing in fast with his game-breaking dual-threat upside especially in leagues that reward rushing. But if you miss out on a top-three quarterback, waiting until the late rounds probably isn't the best strategy. Bo Nix, Caleb Williams, and Jared Goff are hard to tell apart. Personally, I'd rather wait and have an edge at the other skill positions. ===== Wide receiver remains a gold mine of fantasy production and the 2025 class is bursting with star power. Ja'Marr Chase still reigns supreme but Justin Jefferson and CeeDee Lamb aren't far behind. In PPR leagues, volume is king and young studs like Malik Nabers, Puka Nacua, Amon-Ra St. Brown, Nico Collins, Brian Thomas Jr., and Drake London are making serious cases for Round 1 status. As for tight ends, Brock Bowers is a positional unicorn but in Standard formats, it's a more competitive field. ===== Saquon Barkley is expected to see a heavy workload as a ball-carrier and a receiver during the season. However, his receiving workload was relatively limited in 2024. In the NFL, rush attempts and rushing yards are key metrics for running backs. Saquon Barkley's career. The Philadelphia Eagles have traditionally not utilized their running backs in the passing game during Jalen Hurts' tenure, but Barkley's dynamic style has created an opportunity to correct this flaw.
